Note: The term "guardian-redeemer" is not used in a technical legal sense employed earlier in the chapter. The women envision this lad providing for Naomi the "rest/security" that she had tried to procure for her daughter-in-law (1:9; 3:1). The women are not concerned about the restoration of hereditary land to the clan of Elimelech or raising up a name for Mahlon. They are interested only in the well-being of this widow. (Block)

## **Group Sharing Questions**
